Child Protection Guidance for Juniors' Camping Events

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Principles

This guidance is provided to support clubs, juniors and their parents or guardians so that camping at a gliding club can be enjoyable and safe for all involved.

This guidance is intended to reduce the potential for confusion or misunderstandings about arrangements and expected behaviours.

Conditions

Overnight camping will only be a planned event.

Agreement with the individual gliding club and full discussions regarding the arrangements prior to the event will be held with the Child Protection Officer and/or the Child Protection Deputy Officer.

These discussions will include the Juniors and their parents.

Designated responsible adults who have been DBS checked will be available on site throughout the camping event. They will meet with the juniors and their parents prior to the event.

Written permissions from the parents are required prior to the event. These will include the parent's emergency contact details and information regarding any medical conditions the junior may have. These will be made available to the Designated Responsible Adults.

If the Junior is not a member of the club hosting the event, they will be required to complete a BGA Temporary Membership form for the club.

Juniors without the written permissions and pre-event discussions will not be permitted to attend the event.

Juniors and their parents will be provided with a copy of the Juniors Code of Conduct prior to the event.

Camping will only take place in a designated and agreed camping area of the gliding site.
