The applicant is tested orally by an FE(S) for knowledge of items of Section 1 and the core instructor competencies (teaching and learning content given in the BI(S) training course).

Sections 2, 3 and 4 comprise exercises to demonstrate the ability to be a BI(S) (for example, instructor demonstration exercises) chosen by the FE(S) from the flight syllabus of the BI(S) training course, limited to Exercises 1, 2, 4 and 5. The applicant should demonstrate BI(S) competencies, including briefing, flight instruction and debriefing. In addition, the BI(S) should demonstrate that they can handle emergency exercises such as Exercises 10a, Ex 10b and any launch failure exercise from Exercises 11a and 11b depending on the launch method used during the Assessment of Competence, the selection of such exercises is left to the discretion of the FE(S).
